What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program.

The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair and equal opportunity to obtain a high quality education.

Title I funds are used for additional professional development of teachers, additional materials and supplies for teachers, and parent involvement activities.

Parent Involvement

The participation of parents in regular, two way, meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities.

This helps to ensure that parents play an important role in assisting their child's learning. Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making to assist in the education of their child.

Parent/Teacher Communication

Each year we have 2 parent/teacher conference days. Open House can be in person or virtual, but must be scheduled ahead of time. Open House dates are

Parents can make sure their child is at school in person or remote viewing every day possible.

Parents can set age appropriate goals for their child.
